## California

### CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

California administers CSBG to  
60 agencies in  
100% of CA counties

67% of CA families served were in

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## CSBG Performance Outcomes for California

The CA CSBG Network addressed 2,088,469 conditions of poverty that create barriers to economic security.

Barriers Addressed	These barriers were measured by:
275,799	<b>Employment or Work Supports</b> Low-income participants in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, obtained an increase in employment income, or achieved "living wage" employment and benefits.
118,918	<b>Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization</b> Low-income households achieved an increase in financial assets or financial skills as a result of CSBG Network assistance.
303,314	<b>Child and Family Development</b> Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.
286,497	<b>Independent Living for Low-Income Vulnerable Populations</b> Low-income vulnerable individuals received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.
124,133	<b>Family Stability</b> Low-income participants obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.
815,634	<b>Emergency Assistance</b> Low-income individuals and families received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.
34,054	<b>Community Opportunities and Resources</b> Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for low-income people as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or advocacy with other public and private agencies.
130,120	<b>Community Empowerment</b> Community members and low-income people mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a direct result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
