

The Low-Income Weatherization Program Farmworker Housing Component

The Low-Income Weatherization Program (LIWP) installs no-cost energy conservation measures in low-income single family dwellings to reduce GHG emissions and save energy.

Participation is as Easy as 1-2-3

1. Enrollment and Assessment

To be eligible, at least one household member must be an agricultural employee and the household must meet the program's income guidelines. After qualification, we will evaluate your home to determine eligibility for services.

2. Delivery of Services

A LIWP approved contractor will deliver and install new appliances, such as a new air conditioner, furnace, ceiling fans, refrigerator and other services, such as weatherization to make your home more efficient.

3. Quality Control Inspection

An inspector will visit your home to ensure the work performed by the contractor meets all quality standards and all new appliances are working properly.

Certain restrictions, such as age, size and condition of the system or appliance to be replaced may apply. This program is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide program that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment — particularly in disadvantaged communities. Program funds are available on a first-come, first-served basis until funding is exhausted or the program terminated, whichever occurs first.
