### NOTICE OF INTENT TO AWARD

#### Low-Income Weatherization Program Single-Family Energy Efficiency and Solar Photovoltaics Program Farmworker Housing Component 2019-RFP-64

April 9, 2019

On January 22, 2019, the California Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) released a Request for Proposal (RFP) titled “Single-Family Energy Efficiency and Solar Photovoltaics (PV) Program: Farmworker Housing Component” under its Low-Income Weatherization Program (LIWP). The purpose of the RFP was to award a total of approximately \$10.5 million in funding to Farmworker Housing Administrators in two regions. This component of LIWP’s Single-Family Energy Efficiency and Solar PV Program will install a variety of measures that include energy efficiency upgrades, solar PV, health and safety improvements, and limited home repairs at no cost to eligible, low-income farmworker households.

CSD received one proposal for each region by the March 7, 2019 due date as follows:

<b>La Cooperativa Campesina de California</b>
<b>Region B (Imperial, Kern, Riverside, Santa Barbara, Tulare, and Ventura counties)</b>

The proposals were screened and evaluated utilizing the scoring criteria and process dictated in the RFP. The proposed awardees are as follows:
